BROMLEY FESTIVAL

Bromley Festival was inaugurated at a public meeting in October 1928. The then Mayor of Bromley, Alderman E.Ford Duncanson, was the first Chairman and expressed the hope that it would be a 'Festival for Bromley people run by Bromley people'. To raise funds, a Grand Inaugural Concert was held in May 1929 at the Methodist Central Hall, London Road, and several distinguished local musicians including the Misses Marjorie and Dorothy Whyte of Ripley fame, were involved. The first competitions were held in November 1929 with classes for Pianoforte, Strings, Solo Singing, Choirs and Elocution. Many of the trophies date from that time.

The Festival was held each November until 1939 when, on the outbreak of World War II, the Committee decided to postpone activities until further notice. The next Council Meeting took place in July 1945 and it was decided to re-establish the Festival in March 1946 at Stratford House School. Since then the Festival has been held annually in various halls and churches in the Borough. The present name – the Bromley (Kent) Festival of Music and Speech – was adopted in 1978 and the Festival received charitable status in 1983.

The early records show a strong interest in Piano, Strings and Singing but in recent years there has been a marked increase in the entries for Woodwind Instruments, including Recorders. These changes reflect the greater variety of instrumental teaching in schools today. It is one of the few Festivals in the country to include Harp classes. The Speech and Drama Section has also flourished and represents a greater number of entries each year.

The Festival receives many entries each year, which proves that it is widely valued as a platform for the performing arts in Bromley. We look forward to hearing many fine performances and are most grateful for your interest.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Star Performer Music Awards – A trophy and a cheque for £200 will be presented to the overall winner from the Music Section at the final competitive session on Sunday 24 March 2024, venue to be confirmed.

The Star Music Performer will be selected by a special Adjudicator. Those performing at that session will have been recommended by the appropriate Music Adjudicators. All the finalists will receive cash prizes. Admission to this session is FREE and the public is warmly invited to attend.

Jennifer Molyneux Star Speech Award - The Star Speech Performer will be selected during the Festival by the Speech Adjudicators. He/she must be aged 14 or over by the end of the academic year and have entered at least TWO solo classes, one of which must be either Public Speaking or Shakespeare Solo and attained Honours/Distinction marks. They will be presented with the Jennifer Molyneux Prize at the Star Performer Music Awards on Sunday 24 March 2024.

Celia Yeo Memorial Award – Will be awarded to the most promising young performer in Year 6 & below.

Concert Invitation – Selected prize winners will be offered the opportunity to perform in a prizewinners concert, to be confirmed.

BROMLEY (KENT) FESTIVAL OF MUSIC AND SPEECH CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create **Safer Festivals** for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival.: Name: Geraldine McBain Phone: 01689 820322
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel will be clearly identified. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to the Festival. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection** best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.
- 7. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed in the performance areas at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Section Secretaries prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of competitors under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the competitors to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

RULES

1. Eligibility of Competitors

Except where marked 'Open', the competitions are intended for amateurs. Professionals are however allowed to take part:-

- a) as Conductors
- c) in Open Classes
- b) as Accompanists
- d) in Senior Orchestras

An amateur is someone who does not derive, or has not derived, his/her livelihood from the branch of performance, defined by the class title, in which he/she seeks to enter the Festival. In any amateur ensemble all members must adhere to this definition.

2. Entry Forms

Entries <u>must</u> be made on the <u>official forms</u> in the centre of the Syllabus obtainable online or from the Hon. Secretary, Committee members, libraries and music shops. Competitors who enter for more than one class <u>in the same Section</u> should use a single entry form. Entries for classes in <u>different Sections</u> must be made on separate forms. Multiple entry forms should be used by teachers when entering a number of pupils in the same Section. Entry forms may be photocopied.

Entry forms should be sent to the address shown in the Syllabus at the head of the appropriate section. Competitors will be notified by email.

3. Age Limits - SCHOOL YEARS WILL APPLY FOR ALL PERFORMERS 18 AND UNDER. See Choirs for additional rules page 24.

4. Entry Fees

Entry fees are as stated for each Class in the Syllabus. They must be sent with Entry Forms and cannot be returned. If a receipt is required, a stamped addressed envelope should be supplied. Cheques should be made payable to "Bromley (Kent) Festival of Music and Speech" or by online payment. Class and child's name required as reference.

5. Closing date for entries is 23 January 2024. Late entries WILL NOT be accepted.

6A. Photocopying

In all 'Own Choice' classes a copy of the test piece must be provided for the Adjudicator on the day. This does not apply to Set Test pieces, copies of which are provided for the Adjudicator by the Festival.

Competitors are reminded that it is against the law to reproduce copyright materials by any means, e.g. hand-written, typed or photocopied, without the permission of the copyright owner (usually the publisher). The Festival will not accept the use of reproduced copies of music or speech items unless accompanied by written permission from the copyright owner.

However, when an 'Own Choice' item is selected from a publication containing several different works and is not published separately, <u>one</u> copy may be made <u>for</u> the specific use of the Adjudicator provided that the competitor has already purchased his/her own printed copy. The Adjudicator's copy will be retained and destroyed by a Festival official immediately after the event. This permission specifically <u>does not apply</u> to set test pieces. Performers should use the printed copy. Photocopies may be used by accompanists, official or personal, provided they are surrendered to the Adjudicator's Steward after the performance.

6B. Own Choice Items

In all 'Own Choice' Classes (except where specified), the title and composer/author of the piece **MUST** be stated on the entry form. **Entries will not be accepted without this information** and the subsequent change of a piece is **NOT** permitted.

6C. Time Limits

Time limits must be strictly observed. Competitors who exceed the time limit may be stopped and/or penalised.

6D. Standard of Music

Any competitor entering a piece of a higher grade than stated in the syllabus will be penalised.

6E. Prompting

No prompting is permitted unless authorised by the Adjudicator.

6F. Repetition of Items

A competitor may not perform the same item more than once, with the exception of the Star Performer Competition.

No competitor may present an item, which they have performed and for which they have been awarded a medal in the Bromley Festival in the previous 3 years.

6G. Infringements

In the event of an infringement of the Rules, e.g. change of 'Own Choice' pieces or exceeding the time limit, the competitor will receive an oral and written adjudication and a 'Performer' certificate and no numerical grade.

7. Accompanists

No recorded accompaniments are permitted. Competitors may provide their own accompanists, but an Official Accompanist is available for Solo Singing, Choral, String and Wind Classes. If this service is required, it should be stated on the Entry Form, and the fee for each Class enclosed.

A copy of 'Own Choice' music must be sent to the Official Accompanist <u>by 1st February</u>. In the case of Strings & Ensembles, Woodwind/Brass & Ensembles & Performance Classes, the copies must be sent by <u>Tuesday 23 January</u>. Photocopies may be sent, provided a printed copy is available on the day (see Rule 6A). The name of the Competitor and the Class Number must be clearly stated on the music. The copy should not be folded, and adequate postage must be affixed.

If the accompanist does not receive the music in advance, he/she reserves the right to refuse to play. The Festival may appoint an accompanist other than the official one when necessary.

As there will be no time for rehearsal on the day of the competition, competitors wishing to rehearse must make their own arrangements with the Official Accompanist in advance and an additional fee may be charged.

8. **Programmes**

The Programme of the competitions will be arranged immediately after the entry list is closed. The order of performance will be determined by ballot and competitors will be informed of the date, place and approximate time of their Classes.

9. Attendance

Competitors should answer to their names when called to perform, otherwise they forfeit their right to compete.

10. Adjudicators' Decisions

Adjudicators may stop a performance when their judgements have been formed. Their decisions are final. Competitors, their relatives and friends, are not allowed to speak or write to an Adjudicator before, during or after a competition, except at the express invitation of the Adjudicator.

Enquiries or complaints should be made to the Hon. Secretary in writing as soon as possible after the Festival.

11. Alterations

The Committee reserves the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide Classes, to alter dates, and to appoint other Adjudicators, if unforeseen circumstances render it necessary. If Classes are cancelled, the entry fees will be refunded.

The right is also reserved of refusing an entry without assigning a reason.

12. Pupils of an Adjudicator

Pupils of an Adjudicator may not compete in any Class which is judged by that Adjudicator.

13. Certificates, Marks and Awards

Certificates will be awarded as follows:-

Medallions in coloured metal will be awarded where stated in this Syllabus:

Gold (1st), Silver (2nd), Bronze (3rd), provided that at least Honours standard (84 marks) has been achieved in Junior classes.

Appropriate coloured medallions will be awarded for senior classes.

Cups and trophies will also only be awarded to competitors if they have achieved at least Honours standard.

When a competitor wins the same trophy for 3 consecutive years, he/she will be presented with a commemorative plaque.

14. Mark Sheets & Certificates

Adjudicators' Remark Sheets, Awards and Certificates should be collected by the competitors concerned at the conclusion of each Class.

15. Cups & Trophies

Winners of trophies may have them engraved at their own expense. Trophies must be returned by <u>1 February 2025</u> to the addresses below, undamaged and clean. Trophies are <u>not</u> covered by Festival insurance. Winners should therefore arrange cover with their own insurers.

16. Recording

THE USE OF AUDIO OR VIDEO RECORDERS, CAMERAS AND MOBILE PHONE RECORDINGS BY MEMBERS OF THE AUDIENCE IS **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN** AT ANY SESSION OF THE FESTIVAL.

17. Behaviour of Children

The Committee cannot be held responsible for unsupervised children. Parents and teachers must take full responsibility for all their children and pupils while on Festival premises, and must not allow them to stray from the designated areas. To ensure suitable conditions for the performers, we ask that very young children are not brought to the Festival.

18. Safety of Performers

It is necessary for teachers and parents to be aware of their responsibilities in entering any performers with limited physical capabilities or special needs, bearing in mind the limitations imposed by the stage and surrounding environment. The teacher or parent should pass on to the adjudicator in writing, via the organiser, any such information that would impact on the adjudicator's work.

19. Injury & Damage

The Committee does not hold itself responsible for any injuries sustained by any performer or member of the public whilst on Festival premises. It will also not be held responsible for loss or damage to property which may occur during the Festival.

20. Data Protection

Personal data from the Entry Forms will be held for the sole purpose of running the Festival.

Note to Teachers

The Committee asks teachers to ensure that the parents of competitors are aware of Rules 16 and 17 in particular.

Please see additional rules for Speech Classes on pages 47 & 48.

PRIVACY NOTICE

Bromley Festival (Registered Charity No. 286229) is a competitive Music, Speech and Drama festival, run by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission. It is a member of the British and International Federation of Festivals.

This privacy policy explains how we use any personal information we collect about you.

We collect information about you when you register to perform in the Festival, volunteer as a steward or we engage you as an adjudicator. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the festival. (We do not collect 'sensitive personal data' unless there is a legitimate reason for this – where an entrant may need support to participate in a class)*.

Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the Festival.

We want to make sure your personal information is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate.

The Festival will not pass collected data to any third party unless the law requires us to do so or if it is to enable the Festival to fulfil its constitutional purpose. It should be noted that only the names, year groups and schools* of competitors will appear in the Festival Programme.

THE MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

STAR AWARD – JOHN ESAIAS

After finishing his studies at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, Welsh born oboist, John Esaias, went on to play with the BBC Radio Orchestra Manchester in addition to freelancing with BBC Symphony Orchestra, Concert Orchestra and National Orchestra of Wales. John was also a founder member of the Five Winds Quintet. Following a playing career he was Director of Oxford Music School and conductor of the Oxfordshire Schools Symphony Orchestra. John was appointed Head of Woodwind for Bromley Youth Music Trust in 1989 where he spent 25 rewarding and exciting years.

CHOIRS AND SINGING - NICOLA-JANE KEMP

Nicola-Jane has been a professional soprano soloist and currently teaches choral scholars at Clare College, Cambridge University. In 2015, she was made Head of Singing at Eton College with responsibility for individual lessons and choir coaching.

As an opera soloist, she has worked for companies as diverse as Music Theatre Wales, the Festival d'Aix-en-Provence in France and BBC Radio 2 (Friday Night is Music Night). Her concert work takes her all round the UK – including the South Bank, Barbican and St John's Smith Square in London – and to the Middle East.

As well as being an Adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals, she is a Grade and Diploma examiner for the ABRSM, lectures at the RNCM, and also teaches for the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain and Rodolfus Choral Courses.

She taught for many years at St Paul's Girls' School – a centre of excellence for LCM Music Theatre Exams and is co-editor with Heidi Pegler of the award-winning series 'The Language of Song' (Faber Music), which provides a resource for students and teachers learning to sing in foreign languages.

She has organised Master Classes and a solo singing competition at Clare College, Cambridge, and sits on the council of the Association of Teachers of Singing. Nicola-Jane is comfortable teaching and adjudicating online where required.

PIANOFORTE - LIBBY BURGESS

Pianist Libby Burgess is well-known on concert stages across Britain, playing in the country's major halls and festivals, on Radio 3 and on numerous recordings. As song specialist and chamber musician, she collaborates with many of the UK's finest instrumentalists and singers; equally respected for her programming, she is founding Artistic Director of New Paths Music and, from 2018 to 2022, was Co-Artistic Director with Martin Roscoe of the Beverley Chamber Music Festival. Working often with living composers, her premiere with baritone Marcus Farnsworth of Cheryl Frances-Hoad's *Everything Goes Extravagantly* was selected by the Times as a 2021 highlight. Libby was formerly Head of Keyboard at Eton College, and is in demand as vocal coach, speaker and writer. Currently undertaking a nationwide Bach marathon, 'Project 48', Libby is performing the whole of Bach's *Well-Tempered Clavier* ('The 48') in every one of England's 48 counties, to date raising over £29,000 for Help Musicians, Live Music Now, Future Talent and Youth Music.

STRINGS - ANDREW SHERWOOD

Andrew was born in Kenya, educated in Zimbabwe and having played the violin for three years, won a scholarship to the Royal College of Music. He studied with Antonio Brosa, Sylvia Rosenberg and subsequently with Sascha Lasserson. He studied composition with Alan Ridout. Andrew has performed to good critical comment in many parts of the world as soloist and conductor. He has led the Mercury Ensemble for Rambert dance company and played in London and Scottish orchestras. Solo performances range from Wigmore Hall to eastern Europe, the USA. and Africa. Many composers have written works for him from Howard Skempton to the American Stephen Funk Pearson, as well as an acting/performing role in a musical at the Theatre Royal, Haymarket. He is in demand as a conductor and has worked with orchestras from the strings of the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra to the Brighton Youth Orchestras Trust whose orchestras and ensembles have won awards and acclaim since he became Director. He is principal conductor for European Youth Summer Music and of the Musicians of All Saints who are committed to unjustly neglected and contemporary composers. Andrew adjudicates both in Britain and abroad, and many of his earlier students are now professional musicians.

WOODWIND & BRASS - ROSIE WHITFIELD Dip RCM Performers, ARCM Teachers, PGCE

Rosie's vast experience as a performer, teacher, examiner and presenter, teamed with an innate love of music, underpins her unstoppable drive as a dedicated campaigner for music in education. Her natural ability to captivate audiences and inspire young musicians to achieve their dreams stems from an unquestionable belief that music can change lives.

Rosie studied oboe with Michael Winfield at the Royal College of Music achieving an Exhibition Award in her first year. She went on to study at Durham University and gained a PGCE in 1996.

As an experienced adjudicator member of The British and International Federation of Festivals, Rosie is regularly called upon to adjudicate in the UK and abroad and has forged long-standing links with specialist schools in Moldova, Romania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Venezuela, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, China, Taiwan and Hong Kong. Her positive, interactive adjudicating style inducing young musicians to participate, year on year.

As Director of Music at Whitgift School, Rosie devised numerous educational projects and regularly presented interactive concerts and masterclasses to thousands of primary school pupils.

Instrumental in developing the Whitgift International Music Competition in 2013, she continues to support and mentor young musicians hoping for a career in the profession. As an International Consultant, Rosie has worked with numerous families to assist them in finding the perfect UK school and applying for Music Scholarships and funding.

Rosie was appointed as Head of Junior Guildhall in January 2020.

CLASSICAL GUITAR - GARY RYAN

Gary Ryan has performed to exceptional critical acclaim internationally. He made his London recital debut for the Park Lane Group Young Artists Series at the Purcell Room in 1994 and has since pursued a highly varied career as a performer, composer and teacher.

Gary studied at the Guildhall School of Music Junior Department, later winning a scholarship to study at the Royal Academy of Music in 1987. In 1991 he graduated with first class honours and many awards, including the Julian Bream Prize and the John Mundy String Prize and was subsequently made an Honorary Associate of the Royal Academy of Music in 1997.

He is currently Assistant Head of Strings at the Royal College of Music, where he has taught since 1996 and also currently examines for the ABRSM.

Gary Ryan is increasingly well known for his guitar compositions which combine classical techniques with a rich variety of musical influences and contemporary guitar styles, as in his solo piece *Benga Beat* which was premiered to great acclaim in 2011.

In May 2013 he became the first guitarist since John Williams in 1983 to be made a Fellow of the Royal College of Music and was presented with the award by HRH The Prince of Wales.

HARP - OLIVER WASS

Oliver Wass holds a First Class Masters Degree from the Guildhall School of Music & Drama, where he studied with Imogen Barford. He graduated from the University of York with a First Class Honours degree in Chemistry.

He has won the Suoni d'Arpa International Competition in Italy, the International Harp Competition of Slovenia, and the Jury Prize at the International Harp Competition in Szeged, Hungary. In May 2016 he became the first harpist ever to win the Guildhall Gold Medal – the Guildhall's most prestigious prize. Previous winners of the competition include Jacqueline du Pré, Bryn Terfel and Tasmin Little.

He has performed every major harp concerto, including *Lyra Angelica* with the Philharmonia Orchestra, the Mozart *Flute and Harp Concerto* with The Mozartists at the Wigmore Hall, and he has directed the Handel Harp Concerto and the Debussy Danses in the Wigmore Hall.

Oliver studied with Charlotte Seale at the Junior Department of the Guildhall, and was also Principal Harp in the National Youth Orchestra. He spent his teenage years making fireworks in his parents' basement, which is – remarkably – still surviving.

ANITA DOWNEY

Anita began her career as an academic studying at Oxford and Nottingham Universities. After qualifying as a teacher she worked in both Primary and Secondary schools. She happily combined her academic teaching with her love of the Arts. She trained as a Drama Teacher at Guildhall School of Speech and Drama and Central School of Speech and Drama.

Pioneering the integration scheme for Surrey and also working with profoundly deaf youngsters, she then set up a Creative Arts Program for them.

Winning the International Professor Van Lawrence Award for her research into Voice Sounds led her to research further for her PhD, 'The Cultural Rhythms of the World.' This has led to her working with such diverse disciplines as: Formula 1, Opera, The Stock Exchange and with International speakers.

Anita not only teaches but examines and adjudicates all over the world. She is a member of STSD and an adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals.

NEIL STANLLEY

With 25 years teaching experience, Neil Stanley is currently Head of English and Literacy at Frewen College. Located on the borders of Kent and East Sussex, Frewen College is a leading dyslexia specialist school. Neil has previously worked in a number of secondary schools in London and East Sussex. In addition, he spent six years as an educational consultant, which included three years as an Ofsted Inspector.

In 2009, Neil joined the LAMDA examiners panel and now leads a team of LAMDA examiners. His work for LAMDA has taken him to France, Spain, Australia, Malaysia, India and the United States. Recently, Neil has participated in training new examiners.

Neil lives in Eastbourne with his wife Tanya and their children. He is looking forward to this return visit to the Bromley Festival. In recent years, Neil has adjudicated at festivals in Reigate and Redhill, Chichester, Kent and Coulsdon and Purley.

LULU DALE

After winning the coveted Sylvia Strutt Award for Verse Speaking at the Royal Central School of Speech & Drama, Lulu went on to further training at Richmond Drama School where she was short-listed for the Richmond Drama Awards. She then worked as an actress and freelance radio artist for the BBC and ran Performing Arts classes for more than 15 years.

She has always taught Speech & Drama and has adjudicated and examined overseas as well in the UK. She is currently the Senior Assessor (Speech) for the English Speaking Board International (Ltd).

JEAN-MARC PERRET

Jean-Marc trained at the Bristol Old Vic Theatre School. Main Theatre credits include: Royal Shakespeare Company, Birmingham Rep, Derby Playhouse and West Yorkshire Playhouse. Numerous TV & Film appearances incl. playing Prince Caspian in the successful BBC Bafta nominated series *The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe* and *Revelation* (Romulus Films) with Terence Stamp and Ron Moody. Jean-Marc made appearances in *This Is Us* (Season 2) for NBC as well as the US series *American Woman* (Warner Bros). Whilst working in Los Angeles, Jean-Marc was fortunate to attend the Oscars 2017 ceremony at The Dolby Theatre in Los Angeles.

Jean-Marc's examining experience includes London College of Music in Drama / Communication / Musical Theatre subjects (5yrs) LAMDA (10yrs) and Trinity College, London (2yrs). He gained a Licenciate Acting/Teaching diploma in 1996 and is a Guest Adjudicator for The British International Federation of Festivals (BIFF). During the COVID lockdown, Jean-Marc set up an association with Dreamaker Drama Academy in Beijing and Shanghai preparing pupils online in Speech Writing and Public Speaking and these classes are growing from strength to strength.

Further to these commitments, Jean-Marc trained as a certified British Academy of Dramatic Combat fight instructor helping to choreograph and perform in sword fights for projects such as Disney's blockbuster film *Cinderella* (2015). He played D'Artagnan for the London red carpet film premiere event for *The Three Musketeers* (2011) which starred Orlando Bloom and Christoph Waltz. Jean-Marc was also the guest performer at a World Cup and Commonwealth Fencing Champions Exhibition event in preparation for the Tokyo Olympics 2020 held at the prestigious King's School, Canterbury. - b. <u>Duologues and group dramatic activities</u> are <u>not</u> covered by the Agreement in a above, and <u>competitors in the Classes concerned must obtain permission to perform from the authors and/or publishers, pay any necessary royalty fees, and <u>present the receipt to the Adjudicator</u>. <u>These Classes are marked</u> * (D7, D10-D11, D69-D74) Competitors are reminded to apply in plenty of time for licences as permission can take up to 6 weeks and that it should be approved before entries are submitted in January. Plays published before 1948 are exempt from copyright.</u>
- c. NO ALTERATION MAY BE MADE TO PUBLISHED TEXTS. UK Copyright law does not allow for adaptations.
- d. All items to be performed **from memory** except in Reading Classes.
- e. Teachers should select material suitable to the ages of the performers, bearing in mind that younger children may be present in the Hall.

- f. Simple costumes and hand-held props may be used for duologues and acted scenes (<u>not verse-speaking</u>). The stage must be set by the performers and cleared <u>within</u> the given time limit.

- 6. There is no Official Accompanist for these classes. Performers may provide their own pianist or use a pre-recorded backing tape or CD. A piano and a CD player will be available but the performer is responsible for operating the machine.
- 7. Any amplification must be provided by the performer.
