#### Letter from Joint Chairs

We were both very pleased with the success of the 2025 Festival.

Thank you to all the parents, teachers, adjudicators and performers who were involved in the 2025 Festival and we would especially like to recognise our volunteer stewards, section heads and committee, without whom the Festival could not have taken place.

There was a positive attitude throughout the Festival from the participants, parents, teachers, adjudicators, supporters and the Festival team.

The merging of the strings, wind/brass and guitar at one venue with one adjudicator worked well, giving more support to these sections and proved to be popular with entrants and we are hoping to continue this union. Speech and Piano were the largest sections as usual but we had good support for other sections. We are always looking to grow, so please encourage others to enter for 2026.

Our Star Performer competition was adjudicated by Geoffrey Lynn, who chose Morihide Fujiyama (guitarist) to be the overall music winner. It was decided that the Jennifer Molyneaux speech award was to be given to Alisha Assebey Masa.

The 2025 Festival concluded with the Prizewinners Concert on 10th May at St George's Church, Bickley when we saw a wonderful collection of performers from the music and speech sections showing the wide range of talents embraced by our Festival. At the concert we gave out 6 Celia Yeo awards and had 3 trophies for 3 times winners along with a host of other awards and winners, it is a joy to see beginners through to veterans of the Festival growing in confidence and skills from year to year.

We are often asked why we need to charge admission, so to give you an idea of what is involved with running the Bromley Festival here are our approximate 2025 running costs:

Adjudicators and accompanist fees £5,500
Hall hire £6,800
Printing costs £2,000
Other costs including medals, insurance etc £2,500

In addition to these costs there is in excess of 600 hours worked by volunteers on the committee, running sections and stewarding on the festival days. Without these volunteers the festival simply would not be financially viable.

If you feel you, any of your friends and family are available to volunteer we would love to hear from you (even a couple of hours during the Festival to help at a venue would be great). ### **BROMLEY FESTIVAL**

Bromley Festival was inaugurated at a public meeting in October 1928. The then Mayor of Bromley, Alderman E. Ford Duncanson, was the first Chairman and expressed the hope that it would be a 'Festival for Bromley people run by Bromley people'. To raise funds, a Grand Inaugural Concert was held in May 1929 at the Methodist Central Hall, London Road, and several distinguished local musicians including the Misses Marjorie and Dorothy Whyte of Ripley fame, were involved. The first competitions were held in November 1929 with classes for Pianoforte, Strings, Solo Singing, Choirs and Elocution. Many of the trophies date from that time.

The Festival was held each November until 1939 when, on the outbreak of World War II, the Committee decided to postpone activities until further notice. The next Council Meeting took place in July 1945 and it was decided to re-establish the Festival in March 1946 at Stratford House School. Since then the Festival has been held annually in various halls and churches in the Borough. The present name – the Bromley (Kent) Festival of Music and Speech – was adopted in 1978 and the Festival received charitable status in 1983.

The early records show a strong interest in Piano, Strings and Singing but in recent years there has been a marked increase in the entries for Woodwind Instruments, including Recorders. These changes reflect the greater variety of instrumental teaching in schools today. It is one of the few Festivals in the country to include Harp classes. The Speech and Drama Section has also flourished and represents a greater number of entries each year.

The Festival receives many entries each year, which proves that it is widely valued as a platform for the performing arts in Bromley. We look forward to hearing many fine performances and are most grateful for your interest.

## **SPECIAL AWARDS**

**Star Performer Music Awards** – A trophy and a cheque for £200 will be presented to the overall winner from the Music Section at the final competitive session on Sunday 22 March 2026 at 2.30pm at Bromley Parish Church.

The Star Music Performer will be selected by a special Adjudicator. Those performing at that session will have been recommended by the appropriate Music Adjudicators. All the finalists will receive cash prizes. Admission to this session is FREE and the public is warmly invited to attend.

**Jennifer Molyneux Star Speech Award –** the Senior Star Speech Performer will be selected over the course of the festival. He/She must be between Year 10 and Year 13 and have entered at least TWO solo classes, one of which must be either Public Speaking (D49) or Shakespeare Solo (D78) and attained Honours/Distinction marks. They will be presented with £200 and the Jennifer Molyneux Prize at the Prizewinners Concert.

**Jean Lines Star Speech Award (JM) –** the Junior Star Speech Performer will be selected over the course of the festival. He/She must be between Year 7 and Year 9 and have entered at least TWO solo classes, one of which must be either Public Speaking (D50) or Shakespeare Solo (D79) and attained Honours/Distinction marks. They will be presented with £100 and the Jean Lines Star Speech Award at the Prizewinners Concert.

**Celia Yeo Memorial Award –** Will be awarded to the most promising young performer in Year 6 & below.

**Concert Invitation** – Selected prize winners will be offered the opportunity to perform in a prizewinners concert.

## BROMLEY (KENT) FESTIVAL OF MUSIC AND SPEECH CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

#### We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

#### The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

#### We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

#### **CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE**

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create **Safer Festivals** for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival.: Name: Geraldine McBain Phone: 01689 820322
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel will be clearly identified. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to the Festival. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.
- 7. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed in the performance areas at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Section Secretaries prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of competitors under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the competitors to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

#### **RULES**

#### 1. Eligibility of Competitors

Except where marked 'Open', the competitions are intended for amateurs. Professionals are however allowed to take part:-

- a) as Conductors
- c) in Open Classes
- b) as Accompanists
- d) in Senior Orchestras

An amateur is someone who does not derive, or has not derived, his/her livelihood from the branch of performance, defined by the class title, in which he/she seeks to enter the Festival. In any amateur ensemble all members must adhere to this definition.

#### 2. Entry Forms

Entries <u>must</u> be made on the <u>official forms</u> in the centre of the Syllabus obtainable online or from the Hon. Secretary, Committee members, libraries and music shops. Competitors who enter for more than one class <u>in the same Section</u> should use a single entry form. Entries for classes in <u>different Sections</u> must be made on separate forms. Multiple entry forms should be used by teachers when entering a number of pupils in the same Section. Entry forms may be photocopied.

Entry forms should be sent to the address shown in the Syllabus at the head of the appropriate section. Competitors will be notified by email.

## 3. Age Limits - SCHOOL YEARS WILL APPLY FOR ALL PERFORMERS 18 AND UNDER. See Choirs for additional rules page 24.

#### 4. Entry Fees

Entry fees are as stated for each Class in the Syllabus. They must be sent with Entry Forms and cannot be returned. If a receipt is required, a stamped addressed envelope should be supplied. Cheques should be made payable to "Bromley (Kent) Festival of Music and Speech" or by online payment. Class and child's name required as reference.

5. Closing date for entries is 20 January 2026. Late entries WILL NOT be accepted.

#### 6A. Photocopying

In all 'Own Choice' classes a copy of the test piece must be provided for the Adjudicator on the day. This does not apply to Set Test pieces, copies of which are provided for the Adjudicator by the Festival.

Competitors are reminded that it is against the law to reproduce copyright materials by any means, e.g. hand-written, typed or photocopied, without the permission of the copyright owner (usually the publisher). The Festival will not accept the use of reproduced copies of music or speech items unless accompanied by written permission from the copyright owner.

However, when an 'Own Choice' item is selected from a publication containing several different works and is not published separately, <u>one</u> copy may be made <u>for the specific use of the Adjudicator</u> provided that the competitor has already purchased his/her own printed copy. The Adjudicator's copy will be retained and destroyed by a Festival official immediately after the event. This permission specifically <u>does not apply</u> to set test pieces. Performers should use the printed copy. Photocopies may be used by accompanists, official or personal, provided they are surrendered to the Adjudicator's Steward after the performance.

#### 6B. Own Choice Items

In all 'Own Choice' Classes (except where specified), the title and composer/author of the piece **MUST** be stated on the entry form. **Entries will not be accepted without this information** and the subsequent change of a piece is **NOT** permitted.

#### 6C. Time Limits

Time limits must be strictly observed. Competitors who exceed the time limit may be stopped and/or penalised.

#### 6D. Standard of Music

Any competitor entering a piece of a higher grade than stated in the syllabus will be penalised.

#### 6E. Prompting

No prompting is permitted unless authorised by the Adjudicator.

#### 6F. Repetition of Items

A competitor may not perform the same item more than once, with the exception of the Star Performer Competition.

No competitor may present an item, which they have performed and for which they have been awarded a medal in the Bromley Festival in the previous 3 years.

#### 6G. Infringements

In the event of an infringement of the Rules, e.g. change of 'Own Choice' pieces or exceeding the time limit, the competitor will receive an oral and written adjudication and a 'Performer' certificate and no numerical grade.

#### 7. Accompanists

No recorded accompaniments are permitted. Competitors may provide their own accompanists, but an Official Accompanist is available for Solo Singing, Choral, String and Wind Classes. If this service is required, it should be stated on the Entry Form, and the fee for each Class enclosed.

A copy of 'Own Choice' music must be sent to the Official Accompanist <u>by</u> <u>1st February</u>. In the case of Strings & Ensembles, Woodwind/Brass & Ensembles & Performance Classes, the copies must be sent by <u>Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> January</u>. Photocopies may be sent, provided a printed copy is available on the day (see Rule 6A). The name of the Competitor and the Class Number must be clearly stated on the music. The copy should not be folded, and adequate postage must be affixed.

If the accompanist does not receive the music in advance, he/she reserves the right to refuse to play. The Festival may appoint an accompanist other than the official one when necessary.

As there will be no time for rehearsal on the day of the competition, competitors wishing to rehearse must make their own arrangements with the Official Accompanist in advance and an additional fee may be charged.

#### 8. Programmes

The Programme of the competitions will be arranged immediately after the entry list is closed. The order of performance will be determined by ballot and competitors will be informed of the date, place and approximate time of their Classes.

#### 9. Attendance

Competitors should answer to their names when called to perform, otherwise they forfeit their right to compete.

#### 10. Adjudicators' Decisions

Adjudicators may stop a performance when their judgements have been formed. Their decisions are final. Competitors, their relatives and friends, are not allowed to speak or write to an Adjudicator before, during or after a competition, except at the express invitation of the Adjudicator.

Enquiries or complaints should be made to the Hon. Secretary in writing as soon as possible after the Festival.

#### 11. Alterations

The Committee reserves the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide Classes, to alter dates, and to appoint other Adjudicators, if unforeseen circumstances render it necessary. If Classes are cancelled, the entry fees will be refunded.

The right is also reserved of refusing an entry without assigning a reason.

#### 12. Pupils of an Adjudicator

Pupils of an Adjudicator may not compete in any Class which is judged by that Adjudicator.

#### 13. Certificates, Marks and Awards

Certificates will be awarded as follows:-

Medallions in coloured metal will be awarded where stated in this Syllabus: Gold (1st), Silver (2nd), Bronze (3rd), provided that at least Honours standard (85 marks) has been achieved in Junior classes.

Appropriate coloured medallions will be awarded for senior classes.

Cups and trophies will also only be awarded to competitors if they have achieved at least Honours standard.

When a competitor wins the same trophy for 3 consecutive years, he/she will be presented with a commemorative plaque.

#### 14. Mark Sheets & Certificates

Adjudicators' Remark Sheets, Awards and Certificates should be collected by the competitors concerned at the conclusion of each Class.

#### 15. Cups & Trophies

Winners of trophies may have them engraved at their own expense. Trophies must be returned by <u>1 February 2027</u> to the addresses below, undamaged and clean. Trophies are <u>not</u> covered by Festival insurance. Winners should therefore arrange cover with their own insurers.

#### 16. Recording

THE USE OF AUDIO OR VIDEO RECORDERS, CAMERAS AND MOBILE PHONE RECORDINGS BY MEMBERS OF THE AUDIENCE IS **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN** AT ANY SESSION OF THE FESTIVAL.

#### 17. Behaviour of Children

The Committee cannot be held responsible for unsupervised children. Parents and teachers must take full responsibility for all their children and pupils while on Festival premises, and must not allow them to stray from the designated areas. To ensure suitable conditions for the performers, we ask that very young children are not brought to the Festival.

#### 18. Safety of Performers

It is necessary for teachers and parents to be aware of their responsibilities in entering any performers with limited physical capabilities or special needs, bearing in mind the limitations imposed by the stage and surrounding environment. The teacher or parent should pass on to the adjudicator in writing, via the organiser, any such information that would impact on the adjudicator's work.

#### 19. Injury & Damage

The Committee does not hold itself responsible for any injuries sustained by any performer or member of the public whilst on Festival premises. It will also not be held responsible for loss or damage to property which may occur during the Festival.

#### 20. Data Protection

Personal data from the Entry Forms will be held for the sole purpose of running the Festival.

#### **Note to Teachers**

The Committee asks teachers to ensure that the parents of competitors are aware of Rules 16 and 17 in particular. Please see additional rules for Speech Classes on pages 48 & 49.

#### **PRIVACY NOTICE**

The Bromley (Kent) Festival of Music and Speech (Registered Charity No. 286229) is a competitive Music, Speech and Drama festival, run by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission. It is a member of the British and International Federation of Festivals.

This privacy policy explains how we use any personal information we collect about you.

We collect information about you when you register to perform in the Festival, volunteer as a steward or we engage you as an adjudicator. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the festival. (We do not collect 'sensitive personal data' unless there is a legitimate reason for this – where an entrant may need support to participate in a class)\*.

Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the Festival.

We want to make sure your personal information is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate.

The Festival will not pass collected data to any third party unless the law requires us to do so or if it is to enable the Festival to fulfil its constitutional purpose. It should be noted that only the names, year groups and schools\* of competitors will appear in the Festival Programme.

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. This can be obtained, without charge, by application to the Data Protection Officer.

#### THE MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

#### STAR AWARD - PAUL GOBEY

Paul studied organ and piano at the Royal College of Music, London and graduated from Pembroke College, Cambridge with a Masters in Choral Studies in 2011.

He taught at various London schools, first at Forest School (Snaresbrook) and later as Director of Music at St Dunstan's College (Catford), where he took the choir on several international performing tours. After teaching at Colfe's School (Greenwich), he became a freelance musician and has been an examiner for ABRSM since 2010.

Paul has been Organist of the Norwegian Church in Rotherhithe since 1990. He is active in the Worshipful Company of Musicians, where he has served as President of the Company's Livery Club, and is Chairman of the Anglo-Norse Society charity.

#### CHOIRS AND SINGING - FRITH TREZEVANT ARCM, LTCL

Frith is career teacher with over 35 years' experience of teaching singers of all abilities and over a wide age range. The Festivals tradition is something she enjoyed as a young singer, competing in competitions in Auckland, NZ, her home town, until she was 16.

Frith studied singing in Adelaide, South Australia for a year before coming to the UK in 1982, in order to work with NZ singing teacher, David Harper. She won an Ian Fleming Award and was awarded three scholarships for courses with the Britten-Pears School, working with Peter Pears. As a young artist, Frith performed in concert, opera, oratorio and has continued performing in recital.

Frith was a Director and Executive Director of the British Voice Association from 2010 to 2015. She taught at the Junior Dept of the Royal College of Music from 2018-2023 and has been Teacher, Teacher in Residence and Auditions Panelist with the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain.

She teaches singing at St Paul's Girls' School in Hammersmith and runs a thriving private practice in Bristol.

Frith graduated from the Royal College of Music in July 2023 with an MEd in Music Education. She teaches instrument-specific voice pedagogy on the Music Leadership module of the BMus and MMusEd courses at RCM. Her research interest is in singers who play wind instruments, and she has written a chapter on the subject for a new edited volume.

#### PIANOFORTE - CAROLINE TYLER

British pianist Caroline Tyler has given concerts worldwide at venues including the Barbican Hall in London, Enka Auditorium in Istanbul, and the Martinu Hall and British Embassy in Prague.

She works as a solo artist with City Music Promotions and Piha International.

Recent performances have included a double bill of Rachmaninov 2nd piano concerto at St Mary le Strand in London. As an honours graduate of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, she has been invited to collaborate with the newly formed Guildhall Session Orchestra and Guildhall Session Singers on various new projects in London. She has worked with Ensemble Reza in Sussex to perform concertos in arrangements for chamber ensemble, and given recitals with duo partners including singers Rachael Lloyd and Charles Humphries and pianist Simon Watterton.

Caroline is the first prizewinner of various competitions including the Anthony Lewis Memorial Prize, Anglo-Czech Trust Competition, Christopher Duke Piano Recital and Norah Sande Award. In music education, she is a member of the adjudication panel for the British & International Federation of Festivals and on the examiner panel for ABRSM. She enjoys teaching piano and composition to a small number of private students in her own studio and on residential music courses run by The 88 Education and Pro Corda. As a composer she has been commissioned and published by ABRSM and EVC Music, and had chamber music performed by Britten Sinfonia in Cambridge, and by the Isbourne Trio at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama.

#### STRINGS, WOODWIND & BRASS, CLASSICAL GUITAR - HELEN ARNOLD

Helen Arnold (B.Mus, (Hons), LTCL, FISM) is a highly dedicated and successful teacher of harp with 40 years' experience. She trained at the University of Surrey and with Sidonie Goossens as a postgraduate. While most of her lessons are within private practice she has taught at a number of schools in the South-East including Christ's Hospital, Horsham. She teaches pupils of all ages from young children to senior adults, and at all levels from beginners to those taking professional diplomas. All pupils have an individual course of study and may take examinations if they wish - all are encouraged to take part in regular concerts.

Helen is a professional harpist, an examiner for ABRSM, a festival adjudicator and she leads continuing professional development sessions for instrumental teachers based around effective practising, learning for life, sight-reading and more.

#### HARP - GABRIELLA DALL'OLIO

Internationally active as a soloist and chamber musician, Gabriella has given highly acclaimed solo recitals and concerts throughout Europe, the Middle East and UK.

Gabriella has earned recognition and won prizes in numerous competitions. She has recorded for international radio and television corporations, including Radio France, RAI, Bayerischer Rundfunk and Radio Suisse. She has appeared regularly with Gruppo Musica Insieme di Cremona, Wiener Virtuosen and with the German ensemble Kontraste, playing mostly works by twentieth-century and contemporary composers. Her recordings have received critical acclaim.

Alongside her busy performing career, Gabriella is an enthusiastic and committed teacher: Head of Harp Studies since 2005 at Trinity College of Music, where she also teaches both in the senior and junior departments since 2001, Gabriella is committed to general music education and outreach projects, working with communities, schools and hospitals in the UK.

She coaches selected private pupils from all over Europe, is present at several summer academies in Italy, France, Spain, Hong Kong and Tasmania, and often coaches youth orchestras (YO of Ireland, NCO, NSSO, EUYO, Orchestra of the Americas, Ernest Read YO).

Gabriella lives in London, where she freelances with the Chamber Orchestra of Europe, Royal Opera House, BBC Symphony Orchestra, London Symphony Orchestra and the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment as well as orchestras abroad.

Cally also delivers workshops on all aspects of communication and performance.

She is an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals, a former Speech and Drama Representative on the Adjudicators' Council, and a former Chair of the Society of Teachers of Speech and Drama.

Cally believes performing in festivals not only encourages an appreciation of the Arts but also develops the communication and presentations skills so important in today's world. Everyone should have an enjoyable as well as a positive experience.

#### **DELMOZENE MORRIS-LEY MA**

Delmozene studied performance arts for three years at The Birmingham School of Speech and Dramatic Art with two years spent on the teaching course and a final year on the performance course. She has worked and continues to work professionally in theatre, film. TV and radio. Delmozene regularly reviews books for the quarterly publication 'Word Matters',

During her varied career Delmozene has worked creatively with young people of all ages, from running drama workshops, teaching performance skills, and directing both improvised and scripted work on 'A' level and BTEC Performing Arts Courses.

As an experienced Speech and Drama examiner she has travelled and examined extensively in her role. She has adjudicated writing, drama, and speech festivals. These have included performances at Dulwich College, Wolverhampton Writers Festival and Coulsdon and Purley Festival.

Delmozene is looking forward to adjudicating at the Bromley Festival of Drama in 2026.

#### **MARY ANN TEAR**

Mary Ann is a BIFF adjudicator, an examiner for Trinity College London, choreographer, director and Performing Arts lecturer and practitioner. Her work has taken her to Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, India, Canada, Sri Lanka, Dubai, Bermuda, as well as centres in Europe and the United Kingdom.

After spending 13 years in Singapore, where she co-founded the Singapore Performing Arts Festival, she has recently re- located back to the UK but she is still pursuing her adjudicating, examining, lecturing, and theatre direction.

Mary Ann was a lecturer in Performing Arts working for LaSalle, NAFA, & SOTA in Singapore and the Universities of Hertfordshire and Middlesex in the UK whilst also pursuing her professional theatrical career with performance, choreography, and direction in drama, musical theatre, pantomime, physical theatre, and, most recently, chamber opera.

She always had an interest in teaching and ran her own schools in Hertfordshire working with students of all ages in drama and dance. She led a Youth Theatre and was involved with many community arts projects in the UK. She has created programmes for the teaching of Voice for theatre, public speaking and debate and delivers these both online and face to face.

Whilst enjoying all aspects of her varied career Mary Ann also finds time to read, debate, listen to music, go to the theatre, visit art galleries, watch the latest movies believing that it is important to be in touch with the current global Arts scene.

#### **NEIL STANLEY**

In a career in education spanning thirty years, Neil has worked in schools across the South of England, teaching English and leading English faculties. His work has included leading school inspections and helping struggling schools to make improvements. Most recently, Neil was Head of Senior School at Frewen College, one of the United Kingdom's longest-established dyslexia specialist schools.

In 2009, Neil was invited to join the LAMDA's examiner panel and, since 2016, he has led a team of examiners. He has represented LAMDA across the United Kingdom and internationally, including: India; Malaysia; Australia; the USA; and across Europe.

Neil lives in Eastbourne, a seaside town on England's south coast, with his wife, Tanya and their two school-age children. In recognition of his work within his local community, Neil was made an Honorary Alderman of the Borough of Eastbourne.

Outside of work, Neil enjoys spending time with his family. Often accompanied by his daughter, Neil loves to visit the theatre. He relishes opportunities to explore the countryside and heritage sites. Not surprisingly, Neil has a love of literature.

Neil has been privileged to adjudicate a number of festivals throughout the United Kingdom, including: Redhill and Reigate; Purley and Coulsdon; Southampton; Kent; Bromley; and Chichester. Neil has adjudicated at the Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival in 2023 and 2024 and Sri Lanka in 2025.

#### **PAUL TRIGG**

Paul Trigg studied English at the University of East Anglia and then trained for the stage at The American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Los Angeles. He then worked in the theatre for some time as an Actor and Director, forming "States Theatre Company", which toured the UK with a programme of one-act American plays.

His interest in speech led him to take a postgraduate degree in General Linguistics at Manchester University and an EFL teaching diploma from International House in London. Subsequently, he taught Phonetics and Phonology at Yarmouk University in Jordan and was Assistant Director on an Arabic Language production of Ibsen's "A Doll's House".

With the British Council in Las Palmas he worked as a Lecturer and Teacher Trainer and managed the centre's Cultural Programme, producing and directing productions in English and Spanish. Here he first performed a Dickens Reading at the Guiniguada Theatre for British Week, which he has subsequently taken on tour to India, Poland, Slovenia, Turkey and the USA. He was also invited by the British Council to be the judge at an English speaking Drama Festival in Brasov, Romania.

In Turkey, where he was ELT Coordinator for the Istanbul Turco-British Association, he worked with the celebrated actress Yildiz Kenter on a new English touring production of "I Anatolia".

For over 15 years, Paul worked in over 20 countries worldwide as an ESOL and Drama Examiner for Trinity College London, making in that time 10 exam tours of India, where he gave many presentations on drama skills and public speaking. Overseas, he has adjudicated on nine occasions at the Hong Kong Festival, for the Malta Islands Festival and the British Lanka Festival for the Performing Arts, as well as for numerous Festivals in the UK.

He was a continuity announcer on Radio Riyadh when he worked as a lecturer at King Saud University in Saudi Arabia and his life as a teacher and actor in Istanbul was featured on a BBC Radio 4 series entitled "The New Europeans", with his travels in Mongolia also broadcast on BBC Radio 4 in the programme "Breakaway".

- b. <u>Duologues and group dramatic activities</u> are <u>not</u> covered by the Agreement in a. above, and <u>competitors in the Classes concerned must obtain permission to perform from the authors and/or publishers, pay any necessary royalty fees, and <u>present the receipt to the Adjudicator. These Classes are marked</u> \* (D7, D10-D11, D69-D74) Competitors are reminded to apply in plenty of time for licences as permission can take up to 6 weeks and that it should be approved before entries are submitted in January. Plays published before 1948 are exempt from copyright.</u>
- c. NO ALTERATION MAY BE MADE TO PUBLISHED TEXTS. UK Copyright law does not allow for adaptations.
- d. All items to be performed **from memory** except in Reading Classes.
- e. Teachers should select material suitable to the ages of the performers, bearing in mind that younger children may be present in the Hall.

- f. Simple costumes and hand-held props may be used for duologues and acted scenes (<u>not verse-speaking</u>). The stage must be set by the performers and cleared <u>within</u> the given time limit.
